

# A message from Mayor Lund

Happy New Year Hamburg!

Hope everyone had a fun, exciting and safe New Year's Eve. 2021 has started out with a bang. Minnesota Legislature gaveled in. Congress gaveled in. The US Capital was overrun. Governor Walz dialed up the economy.

On Wednesday, Governor Walz announced Emergency Executive Order 21-01.

A few of the highlights are:

- Bars and Restaurants can open indoor capacity to 50% with a maximum of 150 patrons. 6 people per table. 6 feet apart. No people sitting at the bar. Must close at 10 pm.
- Gyms and other recreational centers can open to 25% capacity with a maximum of 150 people.
- Theaters, concert halls, museums, arcades, bowling alleys can open to 25% capacity with a maximum of 150 people.
- Youth sports can resume but many require masks while at play.

Parkside will open to indoor service. Tuesday through Saturday they will be open from 11 am to 10 pm and Sunday 12 pm to 7 pm.

City Council will hold the January 12<sup>th</sup> meeting via ZOOM. At that meeting, we will discuss moving back to in-person meetings as well as opening our facilities for rentals. If you have any feedback, you can email me, and I will read it during the public section of the meeting or join the ZOOM call and voice your thoughts. Thanks to Jason Buckentin for his service to Hamburg and time as a city council member.

The Hamburg Loins are looking to February for their annual Pancake Breakfast. As of this writing, I have not heard the status of the Hamburg Fish and Hunt Club's fish fry. They do have their calendars for sale.

Thanks to all that participated in Mayor's In time. I will continue to hold Mayor's In time on the first Tuesday of the month from 6 to 8 pm via ZOOM. My hope is that soon I will be able to hold Mayor's In at city hall and be in person.
