Greetings Hamburg

Hope everyone is doing well and staying healthy. Last week, Governor Walz announced three phases of opening Minnesota. Emergency Executive Order (EEO) 21-21 outlined May 7th at noon, May 27th, and July 1st phased open. As of May 7th, no limits on outdoor dining, events, and no mask requirement for being outdoors in large venues under 500 people; and eliminated mandatory closing time for bars, restaurants, and food and beverage services. As of May 28th, face coverings for any event that exceeds 500 people. July 1st will remove the statewide mask mandate or sooner if 70% of Minnesotans get their first vaccination shot.

Thursday, May 13th, the CDC announced that people that are fully vaccinated do not have to wear face covering. Governor Walz indicated on Thursday that he will lift the statewide mask mandate as well; yet warned that business and local authorities may impose a mask requirement. The loosening applies to both indoor and outdoor events or gatherings.

The Minnesota Legislature worked on Omnibus Bills this week. The current session is set to end on May 17th. Unless a lot of work is done over the weekend, a special session is likely in store to avoid a government shutdown. For those that have not filed their taxes the deadline to post mark them is Monday May 17th.

City Council decided this past week to open facilities for rentals starting July 1st. With the new CDC rules and changes announced, late in the week, by Governor Walz, we will take another look at our May 25th meeting. Carver County informed the City that property owned by the railroad and the plot in dispute at the center of town are all in city limits. Other items the Council is tackling include updating the intoxicating liquor ordinance, formalizing an agreement with the Hamburg Baseball Club, and gearing up for a year full of events in town.

We are just over a month away from Hamburg City Wide garage sales. If you like to participate, please call City offices, and let them know. When the week comes closer the maps will be distributed. The Hamburg Hawks still have 52 Club tickets available for the drawing in first part of June. \$52 could get you \$500.
