Greetings Hamburg Residents

Hope everyone is doing well and staying healthy. The past two weeks have been very interesting. It took nearly four days for all the votes to be counted in some states. In the end, former Vice President Joe Biden was declared President-Elect. Congrats to Tim Tracy and Jessica Weber for getting voted in as City Council for Hamburg. Thanks to Anthony Van Haften and Kayleen Weverka for running for City Council. My hope is that each of you remain engaged too.

Due to recent uptick in COVID 19 positive test, Central will be going to all distance learning. Per the email received from the school district, the distance learning will begin November 18th and last until, at least, January 4, 2021. There will be no school next week too to aid in the transition from hybrid to full distance learning. If anyone has connectivity issues, please let me or City Staff know as we can help student get access to the internet.

For the next couple of weeks, City Hall will be closed to walk ins as staff has been exposed to COVID 19. If you need a permit or have feedback, please call City Hall or email. I appreciate everyone's understanding and patience as we work through the next couple of weeks. The City Council meeting on the 24th may be completely via Zoom. At a minimum, the meeting will be hybrid.

Governor Walz issued a new Executive Order (20-96) and extended his emergency powers. The Senate basically gaveled in and gaveled out where the House attempted to put in place a review of the Governor's Executive Orders going forward. In the end, nothing was accomplished, and Minnesota taxpayers saw more money wasted. The Executive Order (EO) went into effect at 10 pm on Friday the 13th. The EO restricts all social gatherings to less than 10 people and less than 3 households. Celebrations and receptions are not to take place between 10 pm and 4 am. The time restriction of 10 pm also applies to restaurants, bars, stadiums, etc.

Thanks to the city staff and election volunteers for making the 2020 election cycle a success.

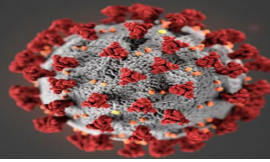

Watch for COVID-19 Symptoms

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear **2-14 days after exposure to the virus**. People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

This list does not include all possible symptoms. CDC will continue to update this list as we learn more about COVID-19.

Please remember that all vehicles are to be removed from the streets when there is a plowable snow event so our streets can get cleared properly.

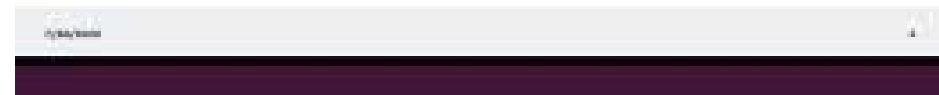
