At our last City Council meeting, we held a public hearing on rezoning several properties in town. These properties were non-conforming, and the zoning map changes brought them into conformity. Carver County Commissioner passed a Resolution to re-district the five Commissioner Districts. Resolution 34-22 defined District 5 as: Benton Township, Camden Township, Carver, Cologne, Dahlgren Township, Hamburg, Hancock Township, New Germany, Norwood Young America, San Francisco Township, and Young America Township. We were in District 5 and will remain in District 5.
