As I stated in last month's newsletter, the construction was not to start until July 9th. Instead, it started June 21st and during our City-Wide Garage Sales. The latest information we have is the construction is to be completed by the end of July. Thank You for your patience as this project is completed!

At our last City Council meeting, the Council and Staff heard from the independent auditor, Abdo Solutions, on the results from the annual audit for 2022. The independent auditor did not find any misappropriations or violations in the handling of Hamburg taxpayer money.

The Council discussed ideas for the empty lot the city owns (Brad Street). A suggestion that came up this time around was to explore putting chicken runs on the parcel for residents to rent out. We are looking for feedback on this idea or any other ideas on how to best use that parcel. The parcel is not a typical city lot and because of that it's limited to what can it can be used for. The Hamburg Lions presented the City Council with Dilly Bars to show their appreciation of the work the Council does on behalf of the community. The Council approved several bids to help improve the Community Hall – lights, steps, wiring.

NEW Lead & Copper Rules

On August 4, 2022, the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) released Guidance for Developing and Maintaining a Service Line Inventory, in order to support water systems in their efforts to develop inventories and to provide states with needed information for oversight and reporting. The guidance provides essential information to help water systems comply with the Lead and Copper Rule Revisions requirement to prepare and maintain an inventory of service line materials by October 16, 2024.

Keep an eye out for Public Works Employee Jason Buckentin in the next few months, he will be going door-to-door to inspect every home that is connected to the Hamburg Water Supply.

Ways to identify the material that is currently in each home is by:

- Visual identification
 - Scratch method
 - Magnet test
- Any unknown's will be considered lead.

Types of Water Pipes (Service Lines)

Lead – A dull, silver-gray color that is easily scratched with a coin. Use a magnet - strong magnets will not cling to lead pipes.



Galvanized – A dull, silver-gray color. Use a magnet - strong magnets will typically cling to galvanized pipes.



Plastic – White, rigid pipe.



Brass – Dark reddish brown to a light silvery color. Older pipes may be corroded and may contain lead.



Copper – The color of a penny.

- Grass must be maintained at no longer than 10" high. This includes weeds!
