



Variance Request - Public Hearing Required

Council Should Consider the Following:

Motion to adopt Resolution 2023-06 approving the proposed front and rear setback variances at 480 Henrietta Avenue (PID #45.0500250) to allow for the construction of a new single-family dwelling. The City Council is being asked to determine if variance requests for flexibility on the required front and rear yard setbacks should be approved. The evaluation of the proposal should be based on Section C. Subdivision 5 – Variances of the Hamburg Zoning Ordinance.

Background

The Applicant, Mark Martinsen, is requesting front and rear setback variances at 480 Henrietta Avenue to demolish the existing single-family dwelling on the parcel and construct a new single-family dwelling facing Henrietta Avenue. The subject property is located in the R-1 Single Family District and is guided for Mixed Use in the Land Use chapter of the Hamburg 2040 Comprehensive Plan.

Plan Review

The Applicant is requesting two variances to decrease the required front and rear setbacks. The proposed rear yard setback would be decreased by 30.6 feet from the required 35 feet to the proposed 4.4 feet. The front setback would be decreased by 5 feet from the required 15 feet to the proposed 10 feet. While the required front yard setback for new construction on minor arterial or collector roadways is 50 feet, Chapter 160A, Section D, Subd. 3 of the Hamburg Zoning Code includes a front yard setback exception that states the minimum front yard setback may be reduced to the average of the front yard setbacks of the existing neighboring dwellings, but in no case shall be less than 15 feet. The two parcels adjacent to the subject property have front yard setbacks of approximately 16 feet and 11 feet, meaning the required front yard setback for the subject property is 15 feet. Table 1 shows the proposed changes.

The existing subject property does not meet the minimum lot size requirements for the R-1 District but is considered legal nonconforming through Section S, Subd. 3 of the Zoning Code. The minimum required lot size is 10,000 square feet and the subject property is 6,296 square feet. The small size of the subject property creates a practical difficulty as demonstrated in Attachment C – Buildable Area Diagram. Including the 15-foot front yard setback exception, the buildable area on the subject property is not large enough to construct a typical single-family home. Due to the small size and configuration of the parcel, the rear setback comprises more than half of the subject property. The proposal meets all other requirements of the R-1 Zoning District.

Variance Review

The City Council may grant a variance in instances where strict enforcement of the Zoning Ordinance would cause undue hardship because of circumstances unique to the subject property. The proposal should be consistent with the spirit and intent of the Zoning Ordinance. Undue hardship is defined as:

- 1. The property in question cannot be put to a reasonable use if used under conditions allowed by the ordinance,
- 2. The plight of the landowner is due to circumstances unique to the property not created by the landowner, and
- 3. The variance, if granted, would not alter the essential character of the neighborhood.

Economic consideration alone shall not be considered an undue hardship if reasonable use of the property already exists. Undue hardship also includes but is not limited to inadequate access to direct sunlight for solar energy systems.

Findings of Fact

The City Council must make a finding as to whether the proposed development would adversely affect the surrounding neighborhood or the community as a whole based on the aforementioned factors. Staff offers the following findings for consideration:

- 1. A single-family dwelling is a permitted use within the R-1 Zoning District.
- 2. The proposed development would decrease the required front yard setback to 10 feet from the required 15 feet. The existing building is located 0.5 feet from the front property line.
- 3. The proposed development would decrease the required rear yard setback to 4.4 feet from the required 35 feet. The existing building is located 16 feet from the rear property line.
- 4. Variances are only permitted when they are in harmony with the general purposes and intent of the ordinance.
- 5. The proposed development would not alter the essential character of the neighborhood because a single-family swelling on the subject property would be consistent and compatible with the neighborhood.

- 6. The findings of fact above related to the small size of the subject property and the required setbacks create a practical difficulty on the property.
- 7. The proposed structure will be farther from the street than the previous structure and will be a similar distance from the rear lot line as the existing garage.
- 8. The variance request is not based on economic considerations alone.

Notice and Public Comments

Notice was published in the newspaper on June 1, 2023. Consultant Staff has not received any letters, e-mails, or telephone calls from property owners or residents regarding this planning case. A public hearing for the proposed variance is being held at the City Council meeting on June 13, 2023.

Council shall Consider

Staff has provided the following motion language options for the City Council to consider.

- 1. <u>Approval:</u> Motion to adopt resolution 2023-06 approving the proposed front and rear setback variances at 480 Henrietta Avenue, based on the report submitted to the City Council on June 13, 2023.
- 2. <u>Approval with Conditions</u>: Motion to adopt resolution 2023-06 approving the proposed front and rear setback variances at 480 Henrietta Avenue with the following conditions, based on the report submitted to the City Council on June 13, 2023.
 - 1. A building permit shall be issued prior to the commencement of construction.
 - 2. The proposed building shall conform to all other standards and regulations in the City Code.
- 3. <u>Denial:</u> Motion to <u>deny</u> resolution 2023-06 for the proposed front and rear setback variances at 480 Henrietta Avenue: the City Council should specifically reference the reasons for the denial and why those reasons cannot be mitigated.
- 4. <u>Table</u>: Motion to <u>table</u> resolution 2023-06 for the proposed front and rear setback variances at 480 Henrietta Avenue: the City Council should identify a specific reason and/or information request should be included with a motion to table.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING A VARIANCE AT 480 HENRIETTA AVENUE

WHEREAS, the City of Hamburg received an application for front and rear yard setback variances at 480 Henriette Avenue, and

WHEREAS, the applicant, Mark Martinsen, is proposing to demolish the existing single-family dwelling to construct a new single-family dwelling on the subject property, and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Ordinance provides guidance to the City of Hamburg, and

WHEREAS, the subject property is located in the R-1 Zoning District and is guided for Mixed Use in the 2040 Land Use Plan, and

WHEREAS, the required front setback in the R-1 District may be reduced to the average of the front yard setbacks of the existing adjacent dwellings, but in no case shall be less than 15 feet, and

WHEREAS, the applicant is requesting a 5-foot decrease to allow for a 10-foot front setback where the existing setback is 0.5 feet from the front property line, and

WHEREAS, the required rear setback in the R-1 District is 35 feet and the applicant is requesting a 30.6-foot decrease to allow for a 4.4-foot rear setback where the existing setback is 16 feet from the rear property line, and

WHEREAS, the proposed structure will be farther from the street than the previous structure and will be a similar distance from the rear lot line as the existing garage, and

WHEREAS, a variance may be granted in instances where strict enforcement of the Zoning Ordinance would cause undue hardship because of circumstances unique to the subject property, and

WHEREAS, the proposed development would not alter the essential character of the neighborhood because a single-family swelling on the subject property would be consistent and compatible with the neighborhood, and

WHEREAS, the small size of the subject property (6,296 square feet) and the required setbacks create a practical difficulty on the property, and

WHEREAS, the City of Hamburg has scheduled a public hearing, and notice of the proposed variance was published in the newspaper on June 1, 2023.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Hamburg hereby adopts Resolution 2023-06 approving the proposed variance for a 10-foot front setback and a 4.4-foot rear setback at 480 Henrietta Avenue with the following conditions:

- 1. A building permit shall be issued prior to the commencement of construction.
- 2. The proposed building shall conform to all other standards and regulations in the City Code.

The Metropolitan Council has prepared preliminary population and household estimates for your community as of April 1, 2022. This is an annual process governed by *Minnesota Statutes* 473.24.

As of April 1, 2022, the City of Hamburg had 233 housing units, 223 households, and 571 people (of whom 0 lived in group quarters facilities). Household size averaged 2.561 persons per household.

How was this estimate calculated?

We estimate households and population with a housing stock-based method, which involves three questions:

- 1. How many housing units did each community have?
- 2. How many households occupied these housing units?
- 3. How many people lived in these occupied housing units?

This letter includes an overview of our estimation method along with a report showing the data inputs and calculations used to develop the preliminary estimates for your community. For more information, visit https://www.metrocouncil.org/populationestimates, or contact me at 651-602-1513.

How can local governments provide feedback on this estimate?



The Metropolitan Council estimates population using the housing unit method, which answers three main questions for each jurisdiction as of April 1, 2022.

First, how many housing units did the community have?

- We start with housing units measured by the 2020 Census. We broke down the total number of housing units in the 2020 Census into different housing types using county parcel data and other data sources.
- We then add units built between April 1, 2020 and April 1, 2022, based on permits reported to us by communities. Permit data is available on our website.
 - We assume that 90% of single-family detached units and 85% of townhome/duplex/triplex/quadplex units permitted in 2021 were completed and occupiable by April 1 2022
 - Multifamily units permitted in and after 2020 are assumed to be completed if they received a certificate of occupancy by April 1 2022 Multifamily units permitted before 2020 that were not open at the time of the 2020 Census are also included
 - Manufactured home data comes from our annual surveys of manufactured home park operators and local governments
 - Data on other housing (boats: RVs, etc. used as housing) comes from the most recent American Community Survey
 data: this housing is included in the estimates only if occupied

Greetings from all of us at the League of Minnesota Cities! Over the course of the past five and a half years, I've had the chance to get to know many of you in my travels around the state or at an event through my service as deputy director at the League. Today, I'm writing to you in my very first day in a new role – executive director. I'm deeply passionate about the work of our organization and greatly value the partnership that we have with you and our 836 member cities across Minnesota.

I'm writing to let you know that at its most recent meeting, the League's Board of Directors approved a preliminary maximum dues schedule increase of 4.5 percent for the fiscal year 2023-2024 that runs from September 1, 2023 through August 31, 2024. Dues are used to support the League's mission which is to promote excellence in local government through effective advocacy, expert analysis, and trusted guidance for all Minnesota cities.

Setting the maximum dues schedule increase is similar to a city setting its preliminary levy increase, in that the final dues schedule increase to be approved by the League Board cannot exceed the preliminary approved increase. The Board will formally discuss and approve a final dues schedule increase along with the League's fiscal year 2024 budget at its scheduled August meeting.

What is IRIS ...

Infants Remembered In Silence, Inc. @ (IRIS) is an 501(c)3 nonprofit organization designed to help parents, family, and friends cope with the devastating loss of a child in early pregnancy (miscarriage, blighted ovum, ectopic pregnancy, molar pregnancy, etc.) or death from stillbirth, neo-natal death, birth defects, sudden unexplained infant death (SUID/SIDS) and other related syndromes, overlay, illness, accidents, and all other types of infant and early childhood death. This assistance includes emotional support at the time of the death and the years that follow.

When a child dies, parents, family, and friends mourn the death and begin the process of coping. This process is known as grieving. Bereaved parents experience many different feelings including disbelief, sadness, toneliness, fear, anger, regret, guilt, despair, and a sense of great personal loss. Parents who experience an infant's death are usually unsure of what their feelings and emotions should be. Some parents keep their feelings inside while others are able to express their grief easily and openly, still others have feelings of grief that are so intense that they don't understand what is happening.

Guilt, real or imagined, is a normal part of grief. It surfaces in thoughts and feelings of "If only" or "I wish I would have." Each person's grief is individual. Mothers and fathers, grandparents, family, and friends all cope with grief differently. While there is no "right way" to grieve, it is helpful to know that grief has many ups and downs and lasts far longer than society, in general, recognizes. In fact, the grief process may take several years to work through.

It has often been said that with the death of our parents we lose a piece of our past. With the death of a sibling we lose a piece of our present (what is currently going on in our lives). But with the death of a child, parents lose their entire future. All of their hopes and dreams are gone.

Bereaved parents have the need for understanding, hope, knowledge, and comfort. Other bereaved parents who have experienced similar losses can provide this type of support. While there are no instant solutions, no fast easy answers, and no timeline for grieving there is a sense of direction, support, and understanding found through knowledge and talking with others about the grief experience. Bereaved parents can find help and hope for the future from Infants Remembered In Silence, Inc. @ (IRIS).

How Do Volunteers Help?

Most of the services provided by IRIS are available due to the talents and generosity of others. Sewing, knitting, crocheting, and quilting of blankets, caps, and outfits are all done by volunteers.
