### **Old City Business**

- **The City Fee Schedule (State Building Code).** Schedule has not increased since 2015. With this requested increase there will be a price increase in roofing, siding, and window permits with large remodels possibly staying the same or even decreasing. Two representatives from Safebuilt, Tonia Sikorski and Alan Greene, met with council and explained that if the price increase is not approved, they will no longer be able to work with the City of Hamburg at the current fee schedule. After some discussion the City Council agreed to look into adopting the new Fee Schedule. Clerk Gruenhagen will look into what needs to be done to adopt the new City Fee Schedule.

### **New City Business**

- **Approve Liquor License Renewals for Hamburg Baseball Club and Know It All's Bar & Grill.** Hamburg Baseball Club - Wine License (\$100) and Know It All's Bar & Grill – On Sale & Special Sunday (\$1,400) are looking to renew their liquor license. Know It All's Bar & Grill is not renewing its Off Sale Liquor License.
  - **MOTION: Councilmember Weber moved to approve the liquor license for both the Hamburg Baseball Club and Know It All's Bar & Grill. Seconded by Councilmember Tracy. Motion was approved by all present.**
- **Bids for Rip Rap Project (Ponds) – Phase 2.** City received bids from Rickert Excavating, Inc. (\$87,422), Wm. Mueller & Sons (\$74,153.80), and Schneider Excavating & Grading, Inc. (\$68,097).
  - **MOTION: Councilmember Polzin moved to approve Schneider Excavating with the Rip Rap project for \$68,097.00. Seconded by Councilmember Tracy. Motion was approved by all present.**
- **Summer Hours (June – August).** City Council approved Summer Hours for the City of Hamburg on a trial basis which includes, Monday - Thursday 8:00AM to 5:30PM and Friday 8:00AM-12:00PM.
- **Park Pond (Ducks).** Numerous ducks at the park pond have gone missing, began at 25 and are now at 14. The use of netting and additional fencing have been discussed for additional protection from predators.
- **National Night Out.** Scheduled for August 5, 2025 with the same menu as previous years.
- **July City Council Meeting (Move).** After some discussion the July City Council Meeting was moved to July 16, 2025.

Xcel Energy has asked the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (MPUC) to approve an increase to electric rates over a two-year period beginning Jan. 1, 2025. The requested increase for 2025 is approximately 9.6 percent or \$353.3 million. Xcel Energy requested an additional 3.6 percent or \$137.5 million for 2026. On average, the proposed final rate change would increase the bill for a typical residential electric customer by \$13.79 per month.

The MPUC may either approve, deny, or modify the requested changes, including approving a lesser or greater increase than was requested for any customer class or classes of service.

The MPUC will likely make its decision on our rate request in the third quarter of 2026. If final rates are lower than interim (temporary) rates, we will refund customers the difference with interest. If final rates are higher than interim rates, we will not charge customers the difference.

If you move before a refund is issued and we cannot find you, your refund may be treated as abandoned property and sent to the Minnesota Department of Commerce, Unclaimed Property Unit.
